MEMORANDUM TO THE SPECIAL ASSISTANT TO THE DIRECTOR, DEFENSE SECURITY ASSISTANCE AGENCY

SUBJECT: Proposed Revision of FY 1976/FY 1977 Authorizing Legislative Proposal for Security Assistance

We note, with respect to the draft legislation on Security Assistance circulated by your memorandum of October 21, 1975, that a proposed new Chapter 5 of Part II of the FAA of 1961 would give the President wider discretionary authority than he has previously had for the allocation of \$30.7 million (FY 1976) for military education and training. Before DOD approves the State Department draft, we strongly suggest that we be assured that the new Chapter 5 as drafted is broad enough in its grant of authority to the President to assure that the striking of the language in Section 504(a)(1) making an exception to the "thirty-one country" Security Assistance expenditure limitation for training of Western Hemisphere countries in the United States and the Canal Zone will not affect the principle which that language embodies.

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#### FY 1976 MILITARY ASSISTANCE TRAINING PROGRAM

#### Overview

 Planned fiscal year 1976 funding for MAP training for the following countries exceeds the programs funded in 1975:

Argentina	\$100,000	\$325,000	\$920,000
Ecuador	400,000	558,000	930,000

The fiscal year 1975 amounts shown above reflect partial year programs, i.e., MAP training for Argentina resumed in May 1975 while the Ecuador and Haiti programs resumed earlier in the fiscal year.

#### Argentina

- Maintenance training is needed to support the military equipment purchased through military sales since the phase out of the grant material program in fiscal year 1968.
- The proposed small military training program is needed for the selected skills required for force modernization and increased military professionalism.
- Funding programmed through December 31 provides both overseas and United States training related to equipment maintenance, communications and electronics gear, supply operations, and general orientation.

#### Ecuador

- The proposed training program is needed for modernizing the armed forces, developing a cadre of technicians, and enhancing favorable military relations.
- Funding programmed through December 31 provides both overseas and United States training in equipment maintenance, communications and electronics gear, logistics, and other professional and specialized training.

### Haiti

- Training is needed to promote a moderate self-defense capability including modernization of naval forces and an expanded sea rescue capability.
- Funding programmed through December 31 provides flying, maintenance, and professional and specialized training in the United States.

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
