MEMORANDUM FOR GENERAL FISH

SUBJECT: HIRC Subcommittee on International Security and Scientific  
Affairs (Chairman Zablocki) Additional Questions from 31 March  
Hearing

1. General Fish, on page three of your testimony, you note that about  
483,000 foreign personnel have been trained under American training programs.  
You stated, "Participation in this program often creates ties to the U.S.  
that endure long after the actual training experience is completed."

a. Could you please submit for the record the names of high ranking  
military and governmental leaders in foreign countries today who  
received such training from the U.S.?

1) Could you indicate how many, if any, of these have participated  
in coup d'etats against elected governments?

5. It has been reported by Administration officials that hundreds of the  
graduates of the IMET program and its predecessor program under MAP have  
since become heads of state, chiefs of staff, ministers, ambassadors, and  
elected officials.

a. What are the latest figures for these categories (by country if possible)?

b. Which current and recent heads of state are graduates?

To respond DIA has provided a listing, by country, of the high-ranking military  
and governmental leaders, heads of state, chiefs of staff, etc. Names marked  
by (\*) have received training from the United States. Those marked by (+)  
have been involved in coup d'etats against elected governments (Tab A).

Additionally, Colonel Ellis has compiled the figures for 5(a) which is at  
Tab B.
