1. Strategic Importance

Argentina is the second largest country in South America in both area and population and geographically dominates the eastern approaches to the ocean routes between the South Atlantic and Pacific Oceans that transit the Drake Passage, Beagle Channel and the Strait of Magellan. This southern tip, due to its proximity to the Antarctic, is an area of continuing interest to the world's major powers. Argentina has an active interest in Antarctica and will play a major role in any future developments there. Argentina is not only of strategic importance to the United States because of its size and geographic location, but also because of its increasing influence in Latin America and its relatively advanced scientific and cultural development. With the possibility of a deterioration in relations between Chile and Peru, Argentina's influence could be important. An Argentine Government favorably disposed towards the US is an asset in gaining hemispheric support for US policies and positions, as well as a factor in broader international considerations.



(1) 2. US Security Assistance Objectives

- a. Support Army force modernization to improve Argentina's external/internal capabilities.
- b. Support Navy force modernization which will enhance the Argentine Navy's ASW and convoy-protection capabilities in the South Atlantic to include the Strait of Magellan.
 - c. Support Air Force aircraft standardization and modernization.
- d. Support the establishment of a strong MOD and JCS staff with supporting joint operational centers and command and control and communications network.
- e. Be responsive to specialized training for modern management techniques related to the introduction of new equipment and to improve in-country capabilities.
- f. Enhance the position of the United States as the predominant foreign military influence and foster pro-US military orientation.



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- g. Support improvements to Argentine military coastal airfields which make those airfields and related POL storage/aprons useable by modern US patrol aircraft on prolonged operations during a possible conflict.
- h. Support ongoing efforts towards increased cooperation between the armed forces of the United States and Argentina in the field of research and development, as established by the bilateral agreement of 1970 and amplified by exchanges between the US Secretary of Defense and Argentine Minister of Defense.

(1) 3.

Threat

Urban terrorism, including bombings, murders, kidnappings and raids on military installations, continues to be a serious threat to Argentine institutions. Terrorism has spread to predominately rural areas as the terrorists seek safe havens and staging areas. Terrorist acts have occurred in virtually all parts of the country. Although anti-terrorist activities have scored some successes, terrorism has not been eliminated in Argentina, and several groups, notably the Montoneros, retain considerable capabilities. Argentina still remains a base for extremists of other countries, particularly Chile, Uruguay and Bolivia, and there is some evidence of coordination among these groups and with the ERP in Argentina.



4. Program Description

The proposed security assistance program provides for International Military Education and Training and foreign military sales at a level to be responsive to priority modernization requirements of the Argentine Armed Forces at no detriment to the Argentine economy. All services will continue to upgrade and modernize aviation inventories. Support equipment is required for aircraft now on hand and projected. The program will support the Argentine Navy's exports to modernize ASW and ocean patrol capabilities. Within the Army, emphasis will be on improving the currently limited air mobile capability and improvement and modernization of tank/anti-tank, artillery, engineer and command and control capabilities. The Navy's program consists of replacement of its aircraft carrier, acquisition of GEARING class destroyers, upgrading of patrol/carrier-based/training aircraft and amphibious/riverine craft, and modernization of Marine Corps equipment including mobile command and control centers and ground electronics detection equipment. The Air Force is concentrating on expansion of its C-130 fleet, modernization of fighter aircraft, aimed at replacement of F-86s with A-4s and eventual acquisition of F-5s as the standard Argentine Air Force fighter.

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

Paraguay



(1) 1. Strategic Importance

The US has no military strategic interest in Paraguay. Paraguay's limited importance to regional stability stems from its location as a buffer state between rivals Argentina and Brazil. The US values the continued support of Paraguay on most international issues.

(1) 2. US Security Assistance Ojbectives

- a. Assist in improving Paraguayan engineer capabilities in order to improve and maintain transportation networks for force mobility and civic action projects.
- b. Assist the Paraguayan Navy to improve its patrol, logistic troop lift, civic action, and rescue capabilities.
- c. Assist the Paraguayan Air Force to improve maintenance capabilities to meet increasing transportation and support requirements, to improve and modernize air-ground communications and navigational aids, and to upgrade in-country pilot training, emergency airlift, and rescue capabilities.
- d. Improve the armed forces' professionalism through the grant training program.
- e. Assist in upgrade of select military units required to contain threats to internal security.



(1) 3. Threat

There is only a minimal internal security threat within Paraguay, since the subversive elements that do exist in-country are weak and fragmented. However, there is increasing concern about the sizeable and hostile exile groups in Argentina, now reportedly in league with Argentine terrorist groups. In view of the long and open borders, they constitute a potential threat to the regime. The primary threat to internal stability stems from the possibility of sudden incapacitation or death of President Stroessner. In 1973, President Stroessner was reelected to a 5-year term of office ending in 1978. The present Constitution forbids his reelection after this term.

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
