

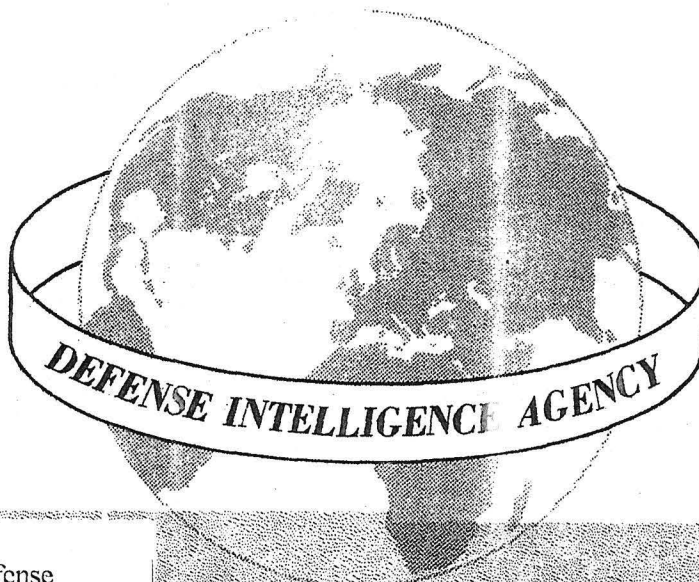

WARNING NOTICE - SENSITIVE INTELLIGENCE SOURCES AND METHODS INVOLVED (WNINTEL). This marking will be prominently displayed on all information and materials relating to sensitive intelligence sources and methods. Materials so marked will not be disseminated in any manner outside authorized channels without the permission of the originating department and an assessment by the senior intelligence officer in the disseminating department as to the potential risk to the national security and to the intelligence sources and methods involved.

DISSEMINATION AND EXTRACTION OF INFORMATION CONTROLLED BY ORIGINATOR (ORCON). This marking shall be used when unique source sensitivity factors, known to the originator, require strict compliance with third agency rule procedures, in addition to a continuing knowledge and supervision on the part of the originator as to the extent to which the original document and information contained therein is disseminated. Documents and information bearing this marking will not be disseminated beyond the headquarters elements of the recipient organizations and the information contained therein shall not be extracted and incorporated into other reports without the permission of and under conditions prescribed by the originator.

USIR DEPARTMENT'S ONLY (USIDOWN). Foreign intelligence so marked will not be disseminated to departments and agencies not represented on the U.S. Intelligence Board without the permission of the originating agency. The Department of Defense is a USIR member; therefore, items with this marking can be disseminated to all DoD components.

NOT RELEASABLE TO CONTRACTORS OR CONTRACTOR/CONSULTANTS (NOCONTRACT). Foreign intelligence so marked shall not be disseminated to contractors or contractor consultants without the permission of the originating agency. This restriction shall not apply to those consultants hired under Civil Service Commission procedures, or comparable procedures derived from authorities vested in heads of departments and agencies by law, and who are normally considered an extension of the office by which they are employed.

This marking will be used in conjunction with foreign intelligence obtained from various sources in the U.S. private business sector as the information may bear upon proprietary interests of the source or may otherwise be used to the source's detriment. (This control marking cannot be used alone. When it is used, the control marking "NOCONTRACT" must also be used.)

NOT RELEASABLE TO FOREIGN NATIONALS (NOFORN). Foreign intelligence so marked involves special considerations requiring that it not be released in any form to foreign governments, foreign nationals, or non-U.S. citizens without the permission of the originating agency.

GUERRILLAS ATTACK MILITARY TARGETS.

~~(C/NOFORN)~~ The Montoneros, a dissident leftist Peronist terrorist organization, claims responsibility for the 5 October three-stage assault operation against the military, in which some 26 extremists and security officials were killed.

~~(C/NOFORN)~~ The attack was the Montoneros' first major operation against the armed forces. They simultaneously hijacked a domestic airliner and ordered it to Formosa, some 600 miles north of Buenos Aires. Terrorists had seized the airport there and initiated an assault against a nearby army base in an apparent attempt to release some imprisoned comrades.

~~(C/NOFORN)~~ The well-coordinated effort failed when the attackers encountered heavy resistance at the Formosa base, and they subsequently fled into the surrounding woods. Border guards retook the airport but not until some 18 terrorists had managed to escape in the skyjacked aircraft, which later landed south of Formosa. The guerrillas fled from there in waiting cars.

~~(C/NOFORN/INTEL)~~ This incident was only one of several last week, including clashes at several locations. On October 1st, the army reported that five guerrillas were killed on 30 September and large quantities of arms and ammunition captured during its Tucuman Province counterinsurgency campaign. In the capital on 3 October, a military intelligence unit's headquarters was attacked and nearby buildings damaged by bombs. Guard posts of an infantry regiment barracks in Buenos Aires were fired upon by terrorists on the 4th, while another group attacked a police station.

~~(S/NOFORN/WHINTEL)~~ The army will reportedly increase its counterinsurgency operations in Tucuman Province by sending two task forces there until the terrorist threat is eliminated. In addition, top students in the army's Superior War School will be sent to the province shortly to participate in the antiguerrilla campaign; the remainder will probably go in November. In any event, the army considers the insurgent problem serious and will press ahead with plans to eliminate it.

~~(S/NOFORN)~~ This Montonero attack is the largest against the armed forces to date, but it probably does not reflect a basic change in the terrorists' tactics. If, however, the Formosa event is followed by other major assaults, it could indicate intensified antimilitary activities. The Montoneros' professed objective is to provoke the armed forces to seize power, which the terrorists believe would gain them popular support for further actions. The military, however, are aware of this ploy and are not likely to be provoked into irresponsible acts. Nonetheless, the incidents will probably speed up activities of the recently created Internal Security Council, which is designed to coordinate countersubversion efforts by the government and security forces. ~~(CDS-31 Dec 83)~~
