

KEY TO CLASSIFICATION AND HANDLING CAVEAT ABBREVIATIONS USED IN DEFENSE INTELLIGENCE AGENCY CURRENT INTELLI-GENCE PUBLICATIONS.

TOP SECRET (TS); SECRET (S); CONFIDENTIAL (C)

WARNING NOTICE - SENSITIVE INTELLIGENCE SOURCES AND METHODS INVOLVED (WNINTEL). This marking will be prominently displayed on all information and materials relating to sensitive intelligence sources and methods. Materials so marked will not be disseminated in any marker outside authorized clannels without the permission of the originating department and an assessment by the senior intelligence officer in the disseminating department as to the potential risk to the national security and to the intelligence sources and methods involved.

DISSEMINATION AND EXTRACTION OF INFORM MON CONTROLLED BY ORIGINATOR (ORCON). This marking shall be used when unique source sensitivity factors, known to the originator, require strict compliance with third agency rule procedures, in addition to a continuing knowledge and supervision on the part of the originator as to the extent to which the original document and information contained therein is disseminated. Documents and information bearing this marking will not be disseminated beyond the leadquarters elements of the recipient organizations and the information contained therein shall not be extracted and incorporated into other reports without the permission of and under conditions prescribed by the originator.

USIB DEPARTMENTS ONLY (USIBONLY). Foreign intelligence so marked will not be disseminated to departments and agencies not represented on the U.S. Intelligence Board without the permission of the originating agency. The Department of Defense is a USIB member; therefore, items with this marking can be disseminated to all Dop components.

NOT RELEASABLE TO CONTRACTORS OR CONTRACTOR/CONSULTANTS (NOCCNTRACT). Foreign intelligence so marked shall not be disseminated to contractors or contractor consultants without the permission of the originating agency. This restriction shall not apply to those consultants hired under Civil Service Commission procedures, or comparable procedures derived from authorities vested in heads of departments and ager dies by law, and who are normally considered an extension of the office by which they are employed.

CAUTION - PROPRIETARY INFORMATION INVOLVED (PROPIN). This marking will be used in conjunction with forsign intelligence obtained from various sources in the U.S. private business sector as the information may bear upon propietary interests of the source or may otherwise be used to the source's detriment. Recipients of reports bearing this marking shall take every reasonable precaution to ensure that the information is not used to the detriment of the source. (This control marking cannot be used alone. When it is used, the control marking "NOCONTRACT" must also be used.)

NOT RELEASABLE TO POREIGN NATIONALS (NCTORN). Forsion intelligence so marked involves special core detations requiring that it not be released in any form to foreign governments, foreign nationals, or non-U.S. citizens without the permission of the originating agency.

THIS INFORMATION HAS BEEN AUTHORIZED FOR RELEASE TO (Specified Countries) (REL Specified Countries). This marking may be used when the originating agency predstermines that information can be released to specified foreign governments.

ARGENTINA

TERRORIST ATTACK REPELLED.

(C/MOFORN/(LILINGED) On 23 December, a major terrorist attack against two army installations was repulsed, leaving at least 60 leftists killed and several captured. Security forces suffered about a dozen casualties.

(C)MOTORNY/WWITHING Personnel at an army arsenal and an infantry regiment south of Buenos Aires were prepared for the attack by some 300 terrorists. This suggests that military intelligence operations are becoming more effective. The incident was the army's biggest victory to date in its antiterrorist campaign.

(C/MOTORNYWNINTED) The terrorists, probably members of the Peoples' Revolutionary Army and Montoneros, hoped to discredit the nationwide antisubversive campaign, which has been increasingly successful in recent months. Although it failed, the attack demonstrates that the guerrillas can strike at will. (MCDB-2 Declassify up to this is a strike
